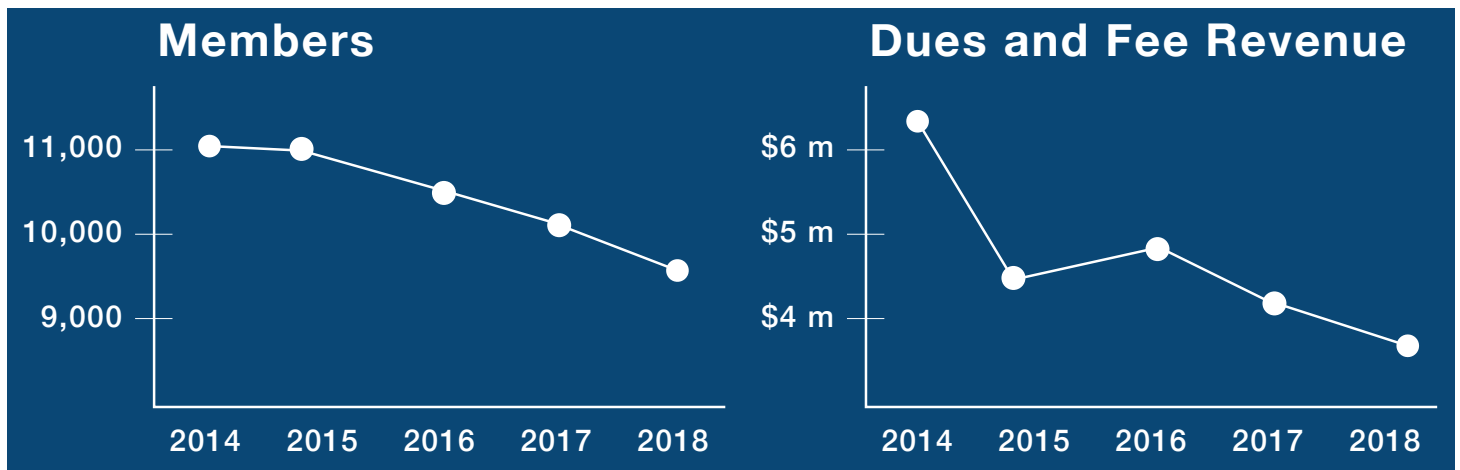




## 1199C Needs Your Money

The union has lost members and money for years



\*Charts are based on publicly available District 1199C's LM-2 filings with the U.S. Department of Labor 2015-2019. (File Number 504-072.) These charts do not reflect the recent loss of 700 1199C-represented Hahnemann University Hospital members. This will mean approximately \$450,000 less in dues annually for 1199C. It also does not include the likely loss of dues-paying members caused by Mercy Hospital Philadelphia's recently announced plan to close its inpatient services.

- New 1199C members are **NOT ALLOWED** to participate in the union's Training & Upgrading Fund, its Pension and the union benefit plan.
- 1199C's Pension is in **CRITICAL** status. This means it could run out of money and not have enough funds to pay members' benefits.
- 1199C refers to union dues as the "Lifeblood of the Union."<sup>1</sup>
